- ___ 2. In Person: Asking for Contributions – Stewardshop #102 (skill-building along with the development of the proper spirit in one-on-one asking for contributions)
- ___ 3. Thanking Six Times: Donor Appreciation – Stewardshop # 103 (includes spiritual and practical principles of donor appreciation and practice in doing so)
- ___ 4. Build A Case: Establishing Motivation for Giving – Stewardshop #104 (building a Gospel-based practical case for giving, participants will develop one for their own congregation)
- ___ 5. Be Passionate: Developing Entrepreneurial Leaders – Stewardshop #105 (learn and practice techniques of “appreciative inquiry,” develop preliminary plan for developing an entrepreneurial spirit in stewardship ministry)
- ___ 6. Counting Blessings: Assessing Funding for Mission – Stewardshop #106 (learn to use portions of the “Assessment Tools for Stewardship Ministry” as ways of Making Christ Known)
- ___ 7. The Key To Timing: Re-scheduling the Annual Fund Appeal – Stewardshop # 107 (how to transition away from fund appeals that are connected to budget-development in becoming steward leaders)
- ___ 8. A Closer Look: Analyzing Response Methods – Stewardshop # 108 (learn how to balance ease with simplicity in selecting the best Gospel-based annual congregational funding efforts)
